History

Founded in 2011 by Jennifer White, ICT SOS began with the ultimate goal of ending human trafficking and exploitation in Wichita.

What started as a grassroots effort quickly grew into a trusted nonprofit serving Wichita and surrounding communities. In the early years, ICT SOS focused on raising awareness—educating students, professionals, and community members about exploitation and how to recognize and prevent it. As the need became clearer, so did the call to do more.

Over time, ICT SOS expanded its services to meet people where they were. Advocacy services were developed to support individuals seeking safety, stability, and assistance. Prevention education reaches thousands of students each year, equipping young people with knowledge, confidence, and tools to stay safe. Programs like Fresh Start Bags and Clean Start Baskets provided tangible resources—offered with dignity—to those navigating moments of transition and crisis.

As the organization grew, so did its presence in the community. ICT SOS moved from borrowed and shared spaces to offices that reflected its mission—welcoming, safe, and rooted in care. Each move represented not just growth, but trust: trust from partners, donors, volunteers, and those served.

Today, ICT SOS stands on 15 years of impact shaped by collaboration, resilience, and unwavering commitment. What began as a response to a need has become a continuum of care—prevention, advocacy, education, and support—working together to build safer futures.

This anniversary is not just a milestone. It's a reflection of every person who believed, every partner who stepped in, and every life touched along the way.

Education




The mission of the education team is to bring awareness of human trafficking and related issues to the community and youth, as well as grow an understanding of community resources and increase empathy surrounding trafficking and sexual assault.

15 Years in a Snapshot:

ICT SOS has provided 34,000+ individuals with education over the last 15 years:

- 26,000+ students
- 7,000+ professionals in the community

Advocacy

Our advocacy program started in 2020, and services include case management, assistance with work and educational goals, referrals to trusted community partners, and much more, as each person's needs are uniquely their own.

ICT SOS has served 249+ adult clients of human trafficking and exploitation since 2020

THRIVE Support Group provides a monthly space for clients to gather, share a meal, and build community through meaningful activities led by our Advocacy Coordinator and interns. Clients also receive Clean Start resources when transitioning into stable housing, access to therapy, and other essential supports. All ICT SOS services are provided at no cost, ensuring barriers do not prevent individuals from accessing care and support.

In 2025, ICT SOS expanded its reach by hiring a Bilingual Advocate, increasing access to advocacy, resources, and support for Spanish-speaking individuals and advancing our commitment to inclusive, accessible services.



Each year, ICT SOS—alongside the incredible supporters who make this possible—helps provide Christmas for clients and their families, serving approximately 45 individuals annually. We are deeply grateful for the generosity of our donors, whose support makes the holiday season brighter and more meaningful for the families we serve.

Volunteers

ICT SOS began as a grassroots, volunteer-led effort—and volunteers continue to be at the heart of our mission today. Their time, energy, and compassion extend the reach of our staff and deepen our impact across the community.

Volunteers support ICT SOS in many meaningful ways, including packing Fresh Start Bags, assisting with special events, tidying office spaces, providing child care during support groups, and supporting outreach efforts. Every task—big or small—helps move our mission forward.

Signature events like the Race 4 Freedom would not be possible without volunteers who assist with planning, setup, and event-day support. As ICT SOS looks ahead, volunteers remain essential partners in creating a safer, more supportive community for survivors. We are deeply grateful for every volunteer who has been part of our journey.

Launching Our Place Capital Campaign

Over the past decade and a half, ICT SOS has grown significantly—serving more survivors, expanding advocacy and education programs, and deepening partnerships across the Wichita community. With this growth came the need for a space that could better support a trauma-informed experience and allow services to expand in meaningful ways.

In response, ICT SOS moved into a new facility that will serve as the foundation for our future work.

Our Place represents more than a new building—it is a commitment to providing survivors with dignity, safety, and consistency in a space designed for healing and connection.

The Our Place Capital Campaign supports the renovation of this building into a fully trauma-informed resource center. Planned renovations include dedicated areas for advocacy and therapy, spaces for support groups, a communal kitchen for shared meals, and welcoming environments that foster comfort and belonging.

Our Place will also expand ICT SOS's ability to serve the broader community. Once renovations are complete, the space will allow for increased community education and prevention programming, equipping parents, professionals, and community members with tools to help prevent trafficking and respond safely.

As we reflect on 15 years of service, Our Place positions ICT SOS to meet today's needs while building long-term capacity to serve survivors and educate the community for years to come.
